# Ontario's NONPROFIT SECTOR



Ontario's diverse nonprofits and charities have a critical impact on the economy and health & wellbeing of people across the province. They offer valuable programs and services ranging from child care, housing, and health to arts, employment, and education.

## We live in a caring province:

➔ **41.5%**

of Ontario residents volunteer, contributing a total of 612 million volunteer hours annually.<sup>8</sup>

## The sector creates meaningful jobs:

The nonprofit sector employs **844,000** people in Ontario, 77% of whom are women, with community nonprofits employing 255,000 people.<sup>6</sup>

## There are three broad categories of nonprofits:



### Community nonprofits<sup>1</sup>

provide goods and services such as social services, advocacy, arts, and sports and recreation to individuals and households.



**Business nonprofits** include chambers of commerce and business and professional associations.



**The broader public sector<sup>2</sup>** include hospitals, public school boards, universities and colleges.

## Contribution to Ontario's GDP<sup>3</sup>




The nonprofit sector in Ontario contributes 7.9% to the province's GDP, constituting \$65.4 billion in economic impact.

Community nonprofits contribute \$12.9 billion, constituting 1.5% of Ontario's GDP.
